Benefit of walking to Wee Green Space:

• Children will walk the recommended mile a day. Supports coordination skills as they experience a range of different surfaces (kerbs, pavements, grass)

- Raised awareness of the local area with children beginning to recognise key features and develop an internal map of where they are in relation to other features. They will learn how to find their way and develop a sense of place and belonging.
- Exposure to environmental print: street names, buildings, signage.
- Learning of safe behaviours when walking through busy streets with fast moving traffic as well as how to behave around stationary vehicles that are parked.
- Children will learn how to cross a road, in a group, safely and the importance of using pedestrian crossings all of which enhance their personal road safety skills.
- Listening and looking as well as concentrating and following instructions is reinforced and practised
- Children learn the social skills of being out and about moving to let others past, greeting people appropriately, awareness of appropriate behaviours including volume of voice.
- Children learn how to deal with environmental hazards such as litter and dog fouling.
